NOTES ON SOME INSECTS ON LUNDY

At the Lundy Field Society visit of 12th June, 1982, I collected a number of

The most outstanding species is probably *Elaphrus uliginosus* (Fab.) (which was actually discovered by my companion, MR. D. E. REID). This very distinctive carabid beetle does not appear in Brendell's 1975 synopsis and it is very surprising if, indeed, it has not been previously recorded.

The records qualified by 'Marisco' denote specimens obtained from the window sills inside the Tavern (all quite freshly dead except *Culicoides pulicaris* (Linn.), which was long dead) and were presumably attracted into the building by light at

night.

The time available on the island was approximately four and one half hours and I believe this gives an indication of the very great possibilities existing for the recording of the presence and status of insects on the island, even while drinking a pint in the Marisco!
